### **Project management**

In a recent survey report on learning needs assessment for Global Alliance of Road safety NGOs, many NGOs indicated an understanding of the link between demonstrated impact and successful fundraising. However, some NGOs expressed challenges on how to plan and manage projects in order to provide desired outcomes and sustainable long term impact. This training is meant to provide you with useful techniques to successfully plan/implement/manage your road safety projects. It will equip you with knowledge on logical framework approach to project management and provide you with a set of tools that will enable you to become more accountable in carrying out your road safety initiatives.

### **Content:**

Basic principles of project cycle management.

Stakeholder analysis - their roles and interests.

Analyze a given situation; identify main problems and their causes & effects: problem tree.

5. To reformulate problems into desired outcomes: objective tree.
6. To understand the logical flow of an intervention from overall objective to activities: Intervention logic
7. To be able to transfer the objectives elaborated into intervention logic and define an overall & specific objectives, results and activities
8. To be able to generate indicators, mean of verification, and assumptions

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
