There has been huge demand to continue the push for action, and we need real change now more than ever. In this 2nd phase, #SaveKidsLives is pushing for a <u>2020 Action Agenda</u> to be implemented by governments. As we move into the next phase of the campaign, can we count on you to hold our leaders accountable?

The objective of this campaign is to continue to raise awareness about the issue of global road safety and to help create a strong movement for urgently needed changes that will reduce deaths and injuries in and around our roads. The campaign places a strong focus on road safety improvements for children, including changes that will keep children safer in cars, on bikes, or on foot. Every organization and country can participate in this initiative, but the messaging may vary based on how people travel in your communities. You may want to add specific statistics or tailor these posts to reflect the unique situation in your location. We have offered several options, but please feel free to customize these for your road safety interests and your culture.

The campaign features 5 news steps for advocates to take:

- 1. **Get Smart** understand the issue facing children and grasp the 2020 Action Agenda. Get smart with our range of resources.
- 2. **Get Committed** having understood the calls in 2020 Action Agenda, sign your name in support. Even if you signed the Child Declaration, add your commitment to the Action Agenda, and get others to sign up.
- 3. **Get Loud** Spread the word! Take a #Safie with our new signboards and share everywhere you can!
- 4. **Get Going** Take it even further! You can take some real steps get more attention for the campaign and get our leaders to act.

To get started, call on your leaders at all levels to tell us how they will reach the Global Goals target to halve road deaths in the next five years. In addition, we call on you to promote the campaign and child road safety on social media.
